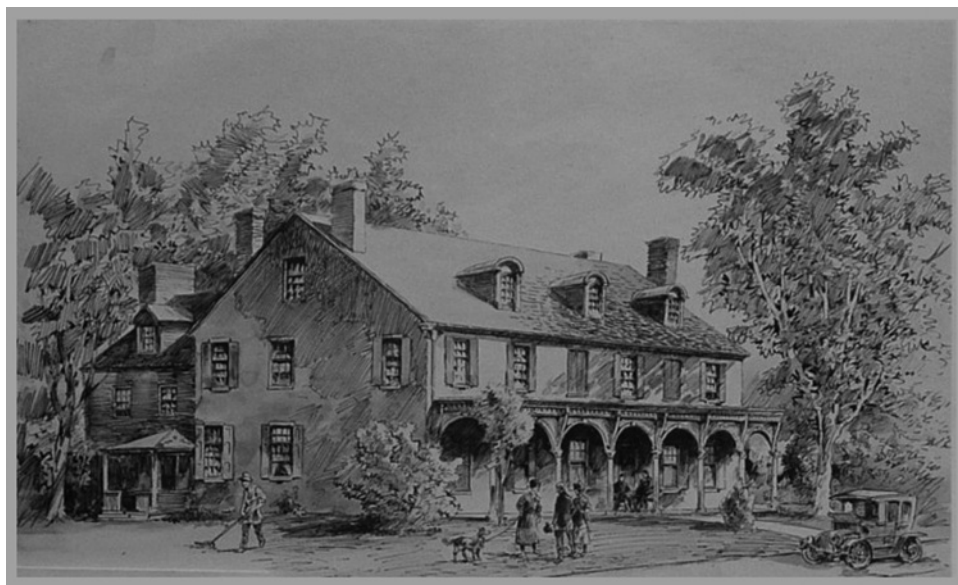


## Notes and Comments

### 2013 S. Paul Teamer Awards

At the Annual Members Meeting in January, two new names were added to the list of recipients of the S. Paul Teamer Award, recognizing especially significant contributions to the Society. The 2013 recipients were Mike Bertram and Bob Goshorn. Though he has moved out of our geographical area, Mike is still closely involved and continues to make valuable and very much appreciated contributions. Bob passed away in November 1995 but his long and outstanding service is well remembered. It is worth noting that last year's recipient Herb Fry wrote the "In Memoriam: Robert Musselwhite Goshorn" tribute that appeared (without author attribution) in Volume 34 Number 1 of the *History Quarterly* after he succeeded Bob as editor.



### Dinner event at General Warren Inne

The historic General Warren Inne will be hosting a very special evening tour and a brief history presentation, followed by a delicious five course food and wine pairing dinner on Tuesday 21 May 2013. It is interesting to note that the original Tredyffrin Easttown History Club occasionally held meetings at the various historic Inns in the area, as noted in this quote from an article about the history of the Club found in the October 1965 issue of the *History Quarterly* (Volume 13 Number 4, page 80):

*On March 7, 1939 the first annual Banquet was held at the Windmill Tea Room (the General Jackson Inn) at Paoli. Originally the Club had these affairs at some historic inn. To date the following Inns have played host: The King of Prussia (once), Ye Old Bull Tavern (three times), General Warren (twice), Wayside Inn (General Jackson) (Five times).*

Today, the General Warren Inne is the only one from that list still in continuous operation, and the Society is pleased to be able to gather there once again for this unique event.
