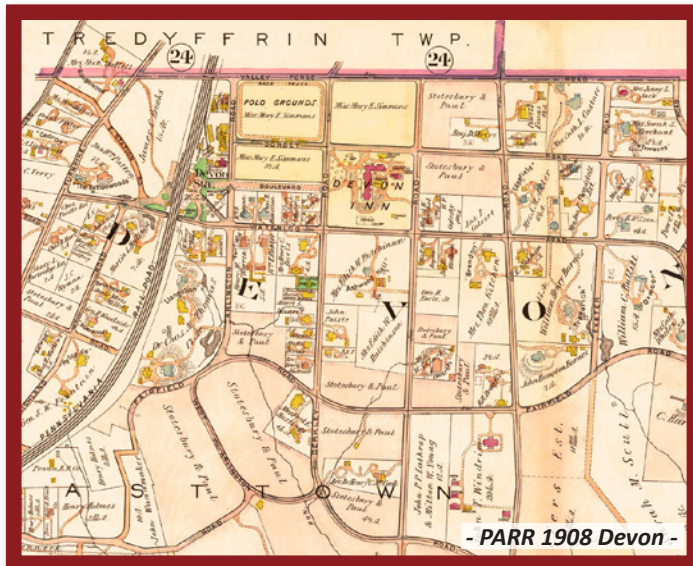

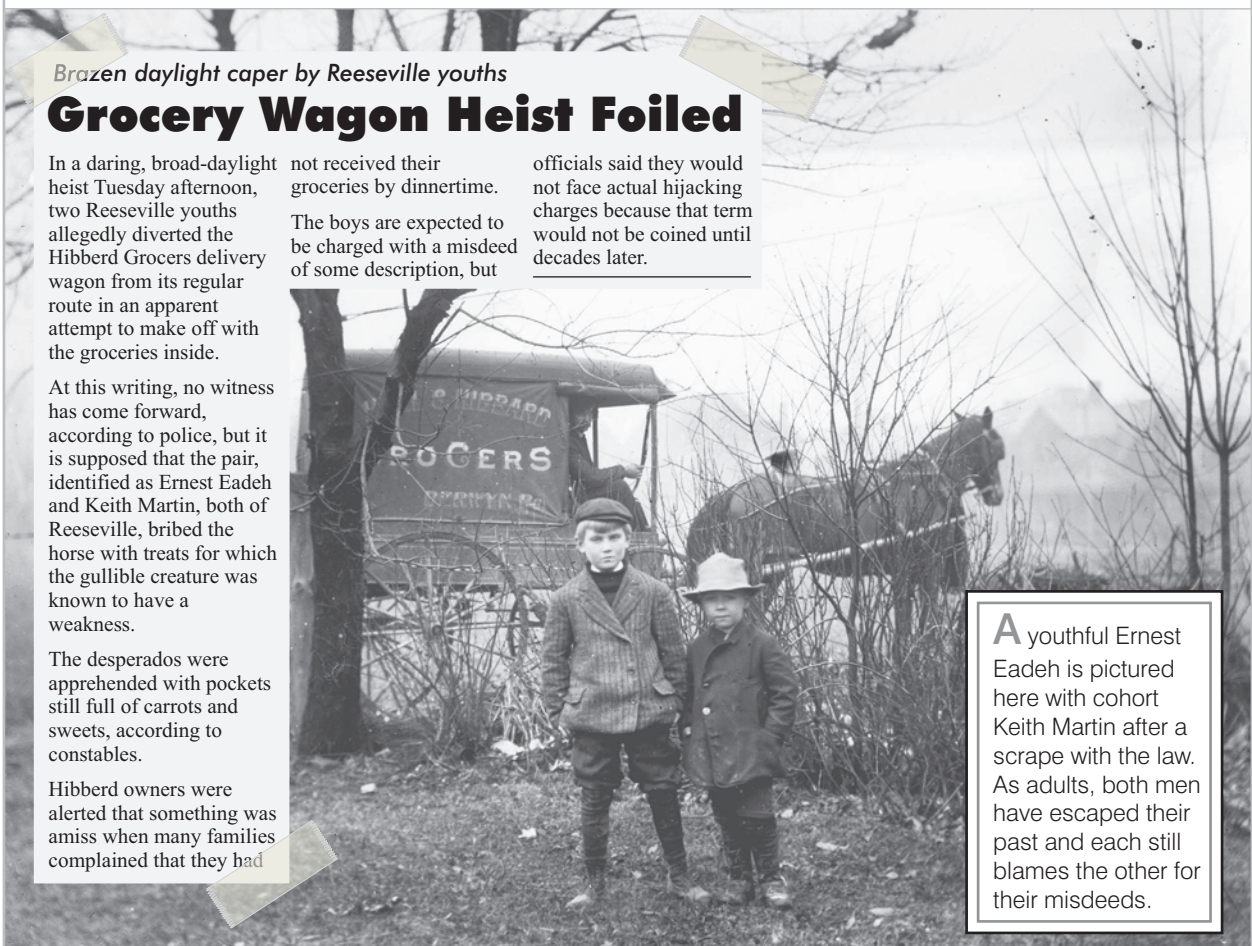
The desperados were apprehended with pockets still full of carrots and sweets, according to constables.
